

What we've learned about you



What we recommend for you

Based on your skills, interests, and preferences, we recommend exploring the following areas:

- Environmental or Animal Welfare Volunteering: Engage with organizations focused on land conservation, environmental restoration or animal welfare to support meaningful community projects.
- Tourism or Outdoor Activities Leadership: Combine your interest in tourism and the environment by leading ecotourism initiatives or outdoor activities that educate participants about sustainability.
- Sustainable Agriculture Projects: Leverage your expertise to contribute to initiatives focused on sustainable farming practices or land rehabilitation.
- Mentoring or Coaching Roles: Use your leadership experience to mentor individuals or teams in areas like business development or new product strategy.



Opportunities you can consider

The following opportunities are open for you to inquire about:

- Become a mentor for Start-ups at Stone & Chalk: Provide mentorship to start-up founders on business strategy. In particular, ask to work with start-ups in the agriculture space.
- <u>Become a Bushcare Volunteer:</u> Assist with land conservation projects such as tree planting, erosion control, and habitat restoration.
- WIRES (NSW Wildlife Information Rescue & Education Service) Wildlife Rescuer. Requires completion of WIRES' online training program (can be completed in under 8 weeks).
- <u>Inquire about Sustainable Agriculture Facilitators (SAFs)</u>: SAFs connect farmers, landholders, community groups and agriculture industries to relevant information and programs on climate-smart, sustainable agriculture practices. These are likely full time positions, but we encourage you to contact SAFs currently working in NSW to see if there are opportunities for you to contribute on a casual basis.
